The bounce house, food, live music, and other activities are postponed until 2021.

- Thousands of pounds of pumpkins are here, as well as straw bales, corn stalks, and decorative squash.
- Replant container gardens with fall favorites, including kale, mums, and pansies.
- It's time to choose daffodils, tulips, crocus and other spring blooming bulbs for fall planting.
- For bloom indoors during the winter months, plant amaryllis and fragrant Paperwhite narcissus.
- Plants that perform in fall and winter take center stage now: winter-blooming Camellias, smoky-leaved Cotinus, purple-berried Callicarpa, fragrant Sarcococca, and heucheras in shades of bronze, red and chartruese.

Create privacy with a natural screen of plants and trees. There are so many more options than a laurel hedge. Ask for suggestions. Fall is the best time to transplant trees and shrubs. As air temperatures drop, roots grow vigorously in the still warm soil. Seasonal rain helps establish a strong root system, so when spring comes, plants are ready for a surge of new growth.

Make A Wreath


