What to do in the fall garden:

- Plant daffodils, tulips, crocus, and other spring blooming bulbs. Narcissus are deer and rabbit resistant!
- Refresh sun-weary container gardens with fall favorites, such as kale, mums, and pansies. Need inspiration? Sign up for our free container planting demo.
- Keep your edible garden going by planting garlic now for harvest at the end of summer next year. Plant shallots and onions. Depending on the weather, you can still plant salad greens, arugula, radishes, and kale for a late season harvest.
- Plant cover crops to build soil and suppress weeds, giving your veggie garden a good start in spring. Come in for our handout on choosing & growing cover crops.
- Fertilize your lawn. Supporting root growth in the fall leads to a healthier lawn in spring. Apply a natural lawn fertilizer in mid-September to mid-October when soil temperatures are above 55°. Apply lime to discourage moss.
- Fall is the best time to transplant trees and shrubs. As air temperatures drop, roots grow vigorously in the still warm soil. Seasonal rain helps establish a strong root system, so when spring comes, plants are ready for a surge of new growth.
