Fall 2017

Add Color to Your Containers

With the change in the temperatures and the angle of the sun, comes time to change our container plantings. As evergreen perennials, Heuchera (Coral Bells) and Heucherella (Foamy Bells) add a variety of colors and interest to your patios and perennial gardens in the Fall and Winter. Mounds of heart-shaped foliage pair beautifully with evergreen grasses, dwarf conifers, and low-growing shade loving shrubs. Create a fool-proof fall and winter container or new spotlight in your perennial garden by combining Heuchera 'Delta Dawn', Carex 'Cappuccino', golden spikemoss, a Leucothoe such as 'Curly Red', and a lovely lemon-scented Wilma Cypress.

Keep the Veggie Garden Going

Now is the time to plant fresh new veggie starts to extend your gardening season. We currently have a nice selection of salad greens, broccoli, brussels sprouts, and cabbage.

Enjoy fresh greens year round by growing microgreens. Some of these tiny, flavorful seedlings take only a week to grow. Choose from a dozen varieties of vegetables and herbs including spinach, arugula, and spicy greens. Coming this fall, a kit to grow mushroom indoors in just 10 days!

Don't forget the garlic. Garlic is planted in September and October for harvest in summer next year.

Autumn Interest

Fall blooming camellias (Camellia sasanqua) will be arriving, bringing glossy leaves and a show of red, white or pink blooms in late fall and winter in the part shade garden.

For fragrance in a sunny spot, try witch hazel (hamamelis). Its spidery blooms look like fiery embers in the winter garden.

Hypericum 'Ignite Scarlet Red' brings seasonal color with gold flowers in summer and red berries in fall.
