

Welcome a new season by refreshing sun-weary container gardens with fall favorites, such as pansies, chrysanthemums, and ornamental kale. Piles of pumpkins, squash, and gourds are coming mid-September, orange and yellow ones, of course, but also blue, grey, pink, and white. Arrange them with bundle of cornstalks or spilled onto a bale of straw.

Keep your edible garden going by planting garlic now for harvest at the end of summer next year. Plant shallots and onions now too. Indoors, a new self-watering garden kit from Sweden comes with its own growing medium and takes up about as much space as a water bottle. With enough light, you can grow a few fresh greens or a bit of basil all winter long.

What to do in the fall garden:
• Fall is the time to plant daffodils, tulips, crocus, and other spring blooming bulbs.
• Fertilizing your lawn in the fall is the most important feeding of the year.
• Apply a natural lawn fertilizer in mid-September to mid-October when soil temperatures are above 55°.
• Come in for our handout on Fall Lawn Care. Fall is the best time to transplant trees and shrubs. As air temperatures drop, roots grow vigorously in the still warm soil.
• Seasonal rain helps establish a strong root system, so when spring comes, plants are ready for a surge of new growth!
